BLUEGRASS SUPPLY CHAIN SERVICES FOUNDER TALKS LOGISTICS, MISSIONS & GOING AFTER YOUR DREAMS

After spending much of his career traveling and away from home, John Higgins was ready for a better work-life balance, which led him to start Bluegrass Supply Chain Services in 2002.

"I was leading some major projects," Higgins said. "And I thought to myself, 'Why am I doing this for someone else when I could be doing my own thing?'"

Serving primarily automotive and food manufacturing companies, this third-party logistics company now provides value added warehousing, cross docking, ecommerce fulfillment, light assembly, engineering and quality support services across a four-state region. Bluegrass' sister company, Bluegrass Dedicated, operates a fleet of 73 tractor trailers to provide transportation services to customers throughout the U.S. In addition, Bluegrass Dedicated provides Air, Expedite, Intermodal and Less than Truck Load freight management to customers throughout North America utilizing an extensive network of partner carriers.

"Our mission is simple," Higgins said. "We strive to help our customers, team members, suppliers and communities be better by serving a greater purpose."

The company communicates its mission through its M3 motto: Make Better, Meaningful Relationships, and Ministry. Bluegrass has more than 200 employees in Bowling Green, with that number growing to over 650 across its 14 facilities throughout Indiana, Kentucky, Tennessee and Alabama.

"The southeastern U.S. has grown by leaps and bounds in the automotive sector," Higgins said. "These new locations have brought together a contingent of global players."

In 1991, Higgins graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Finance from Western Kentucky University and later earned an MBA from WKU in 1998. He then spent 10 years at United Parcel Service working in operations, industrial engineering and business development, leading internal improvement teams and customer resource groups. Higgins has also worked in the global supply chain practice at Accenture, along with 3Plex, a web-based software application company.

Higgins' background in logistics, development and leadership has allowed him

to build a company that is focused on fostering meaningful relationships, facilitating customer growth and ministering to others through the workplace. The Bluegrass staff participates in M.E.A.L.S Inc. each quarter, preparing and packaging food, along with delivering hot meals to over 200 people in the area. Bluegrass also supports other organizations such as Allen County T-Ball, Car Seat Safety Matters, Hope House Ministries, Room in the Inn, CASA of South Central KY and Center for Courageous Kids.

"Our people and our mission sets us apart from other logistics companies," Higgins said. "We believe our people are our strength. We take pride in working to attract, onboard, develop and retain one of the best teams in the industry."

"To startups, I would encourage business owners to start early in their careers and pursue their dreams. There is no secret to building a business other than coming to work every day and striving to give your customers more than they pay for and respecting and investing in your team members."



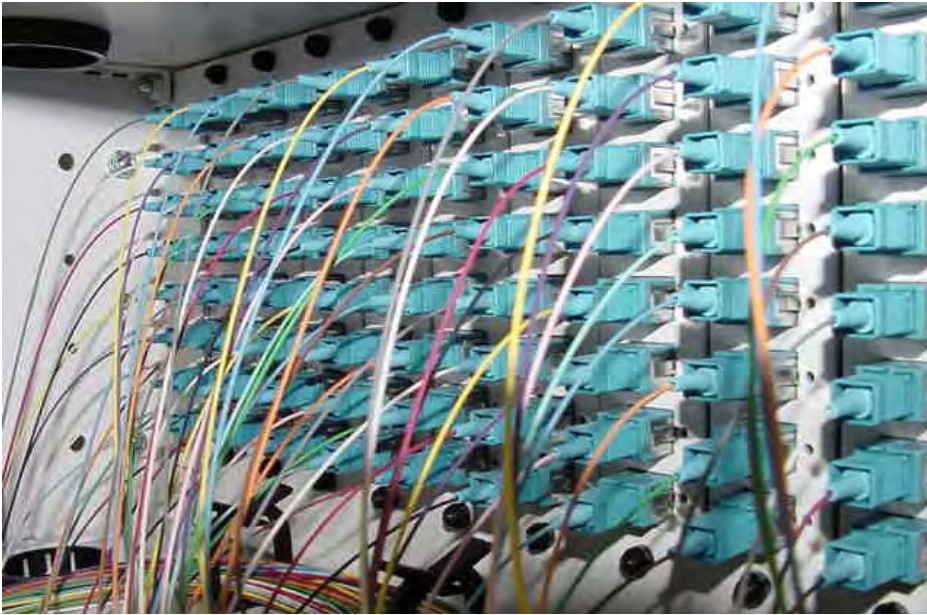

Bowling Green Municipal Utilities provides consumers with high-speed data services, safe and reliable electric service and award-winning water and wastewater treatment services. BGMU's Electric Division serves a population of about 50,000 within the city limits of Bowling Green, including nearly 4,100 commercial facilities.

BGMU is one of 76 of the nation's more than 2,200 public power utilities to earn the highest Reliable Power Provider (RP3®) recognition from the American Public Power Association for providing consumers with the highest degree of reliable and safe electric service. The honor recognizes public power utilities that excel at four key disciplines: reliability, safety, workforce development and system improvement.

In 2017, for the 10th consecutive year, BGMU was named a Tree Line USA Utility. The national Tree Line USA program is a partnership of the Arbor Day Foundation and the National Association of State Foresters. The program recognizes public and private utilities for pursuing practices that protect and enhance America's urban trees.

BGMU treats water from Barren River and pumps it to five elevated water storage tanks. The Water Treatment Plant has the capacity to treat 30 million gallons of water per day, and the system includes over 320 miles of water mains. BGMU maintains over 260 miles of sewer mains and can treat 12 million gallons of wastewater per day. Bowling Green is fortunate to have safe, high-quality water that exceeds government-issued regulations.

BGMU's Fiber Optic Division has served the community for over 15 years. The

division provides telephone, Internet and point-to-point services for area businesses. Services are provided over the only all-fiber network in Bowling Green with 24/7 support and an uptime rating greater than 99.99 percent.

All divisions of BGMU are easily accessible online, where customers can pay bills, view water quality reports, request services and more.

TENNESSEE VALLEY AUTHORITY

TVA is a U.S. corporate agency that provides electricity for business customers and local power companies serving 9 million people in parts of seven southeastern states. TVA receives no taxpayer funding, deriving virtually all its revenues from electricity sales. TVA provides flood control, navigation and land management for the Tennessee River system and assists local power companies and state and local governments with economic development.

Economic development is a core component of TVA's mission. Named one of the top 10 utilities for economic development by Site Selection magazine since 2006, TVA works with local power companies and regional, state and community partners to retain and attract jobs and capital investment for the seven-state territory. In fiscal year 2016, TVA sold almost 7.9 billion kilowatt hours of electricity to 10 municipal and five cooperatively-owned utilities that distribute TVA power in Kentucky. Kentucky is home to 17 directly-served customers of TVA that purchased roughly 3 billion kilowatt-hours of electricity.

TVA manages recreational, natural and cultural resources on more than 60,000 acres of public land around Kentucky Reservoir and partners with state, local and regional stakeholders to improve water quality, shoreline conditions, recreation and biodiversity. Kentucky residents enjoy camping, fishing, boating, swimming and other recreational opportunities provided by Kentucky Reservoir, as well as economic benefits from recreation and tourism.

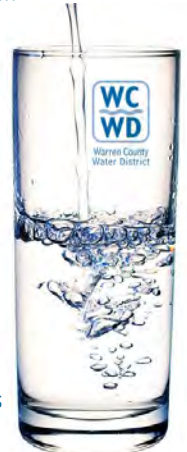

SITES & TOOLS

Office Space Apart from industrial parks, South Central Kentucky boasts over 130,000 square feet of Class A and B office space. Available spaces include downtown buildings, former headquarters, office plazas, newly-built condos and more. Developments currently under construction include The VUE, a \$5 million commercial and residential development in downtown Bowling Green; The HUB, a \$200 million, 103 acre commercial and residential development that will include several health-care facilities; and SODO, a redevelopment project in the heart of downtown.

Kentucky Transpark Located directly off I-65, the Kentucky Transpark is

leading the way nationwide in newly-developed inter-modal parks. The 900+ acre park is home to three Build Ready sites, including one with rail service, two speculative buildings and several greenfield sites. Since 2011, the Inter-Modal Transportation Authority has developed over 275 acres of the park, encompassing over 1 million square feet of industrial space that now employs over 2,600 people.

South Central Kentucky Industrial Park The South Central Kentucky Industrial Park sits on approximately 202 acres and has quick access to the I-65 interchange. Since its conception in 1990, the

SCKIP has had an economic impact of more than \$9.5 billion, supporting more than 3,000 jobs total. Today, the site is home to over 25 businesses.

NCM Motorsports Park The 50-acre business campus adjacent to the NCM Motorsports Park is perfect for motorsports companies that require immediate access to tracks for testing products or for research and development. The spaces include 8,000 to 18,000 square feet of customizable space for research and development, light assembly, or manufacturing. The track is composed of two circuits that can be combined into multiple configurations, ranging from 1.96 to 3.15 mile courses.

I-65 CONNECTOR ROAD OPENS AT TRANSPARK

In mid-2017, South Central Kentucky celebrated the new Interstate-65 interchange, Exit 30, with a grand opening and ribbon cutting at the Kentucky Transpark. This \$66.8 million project provides direct access to I-65 for northern Warren County companies, including those in the Kentucky Transpark and Scotty's Industrial Park. Previously, all industrial traffic accessed both parks via Exit 28 approximately four miles away. The new road is four lanes, with the ability to be expanded to six lanes. Additional road improvements were made to U.S.-31W and U.S.-68 as part of this project.

"The Connector Road Project epitomizes the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's mission statement: to deliver a safe, efficient, environmentally sound and fiscally responsible transportation system for Kentuckians," said Joe Plunk, chief district engineer for the District 3 office.

Since 1988, traffic along I-65 at the interchange has more than doubled, growing from 25,000 to over 52,000 vehicles per day, according to KYTC traffic counts. Just south of Exit 28, daily traffic increases to over 61,000 vehicles.

STATE INCENTIVES

Providing businesses with powerful incentives helps the Commonwealth achieve long-term economic growth. In turn, the Kentucky Economic Development Finance Authority – established by the Cabinet for Economic Development – encourages economic development, business expansion and job creation by providing financial support and tax credits. Read on to learn about Kentucky's many incentives:

Kentucky Business Investment Program Provides income tax credits and wage assessment to new and existing agribusinesses, regional and national headquarters, manufacturing companies, and non-retail service or technology related companies that locate or expand operations in Kentucky. Projects locating in certain counties may qualify for enhanced incentives.

Kentucky Enterprise Fund Provides seed-stage capital to Kentucky-based companies that are commercializing a technology-based product or process. The funds stimulate private investment in Kentucky-based technology companies with high growth potential.

Kentucky Enterprise Initiative Act For new or expanded service or technology, manufacturing or tourism attraction projects in Kentucky, KEIA provides a refund of Kentucky sales and use tax paid by approved companies for building and construction materials permanently incorporated as an improvement to real property. It is also available for Kentucky sales and use tax refunds for eligible equipment used for research and development and data processing equipment.

Kentucky Small Business Tax Credit Encourages small business growth and

job creation by providing a nonrefundable tax credit to eligible businesses hiring one or more eligible individuals and investing at least \$5,000 in qualifying equipment or technology. With certain exceptions, most for-profit businesses with 50 or fewer full-time employees are considered eligible for this program. The KSBTC program is limited to allocating a total of \$3 million in tax credits per state fiscal year.

Small Business Loan Program Helps small businesses acquire funding needed to start or grow their small business. A small business must be engaged in manufacturing, agribusiness or service and technology. Loan funds may be used to acquire land and buildings, purchase and install equipment or for working capital.

GENERATIONS TO COME

IN JUNE 2017, OFFICIALS BROKE GROUND ON A NEW 48,000 SQUARE FEET ON THE CAMPUS OF THE MEDICAL CENTER AT BOWLING GREEN, THAT WILL HOUSE THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY COLLEGE OF MEDICINE'S SATELLITE PROGRAM.

A partnership between the University of Kentucky, The Medical Center at Bowling Green and Western Kentucky University, this four-year, regional campus medical school is the first of its kind in Kentucky. The school adds a critical element to the growing healthcare economy in the South Central Kentucky region, and together with the hospital that shares its campus, will serve as the anchor for a healthcare innovation district envisioned by the community's 2016 engaged strategic plan.

The UKCOM-Bowling Green Campus will be a fully functioning medical school, using the same curriculum and assessments as UK's Lexington campus. Through the partnership with WKU, basic science and early academic training will be offered through onsite classes as well as distance education provided through the UK College of Medicine.

For students, the program offers the ability to pursue a medical career right here at home, in a community already seeing high growth in its healthcare sector. The new school brings with it unprecedented opportunities to maintain and grow highly skilled talent in our region while developing a state-of-the-art facility and healthcare economy at the same time.

"I think the regional medical campus in Bowling Green offers a really exciting opportunity for a batch of young students to come in and essentially lay the groundwork for everything that campus does going forward," said Austin Webb, a WKU graduate in his third year of medical school at UK. "They are also going to be

directly shaping the healthcare in that region for years to come."

How it Began

The healthcare sector in South Central Kentucky has long been a strong and well-respected community, with two hospitals and numerous speciality and general practice physicians. As the healthcare economy has grown and changed, so has the sector in South Central Kentucky, leading to unprecedented growth in recent years. Just recently, the Bowling Green Area Chamber of Commerce released data that shows healthcare to be one of the top six high growth, high demand sectors in South Central Kentucky over the next 10 years. Understanding the growth of our region and healthcare economy, the need for the location of a medical school campus became readily apparent, and discussions of how to serve that need began to take place both locally and on a statewide level. In 2016, a Memorandum of Understanding was signed between the University of Kentucky, Med Center Health, and Western Kentucky University.

Doug McElroy, WKU's associate vice president for enrichment and effectiveness, says this new partnership benefits not just students, but faculty as well.

"The UK College of Medicine – Bowling Green Campus represents a potentially transformative step in addressing the identified healthcare needs in this part of the Commonwealth, and WKU is excited to be a partner in this initiative," McElroy said. "Students can come to WKU knowing the opportunity exists for them to

earn their baccalaureate degree, undertake medical education and pursue their careers as medical professionals all within South Central Kentucky. Our faculty will have the opportunity to deploy their expertise in new and exciting ways, while contributing to improving access to health care and quality of life in the communities in which they live."

Med Center Health

In Bowling Green, clinical experiences will occur in the Med Center Health system, which spans six hospitals and more than 30 other entities. The Medical Center at Bowling Green, Med Center Health's flag-

ship hospital, will be the primary location for clinical experiences.

"As a teaching hospital, The Medical Center is committed to providing the best healthcare in our region," said Connie Smith, president and chief executive officer of Med Center Health. "This medical school is going to raise the bar even higher, placing us at the forefront of medical education and research innovations as we adhere to the latest in evidence-based practice. What this means for our patients is that through this investment in education, we are continuing to increase access to quality healthcare — and ensuring that

we have the physicians available to take care of generations to come."

With more than 300 physicians on The Medical Center staff, the hospital provides patients with access to over 50 specialties. Students will learn about a wide range of specialty care through interactions with the medical staff. For students from the western half of the state, the new program also means an opportunity to remain close to home.

"I think there are a lot of reasons that

future students should be excited about the Bowling Green campus," said Dr. Todd Cheever, associate dean for the UK College of Medicine-Bowling Green Campus. "The biggest is students from that particular part of the state will be able to go to medical school and hopefully practice medicine in their communities without having to leave where they're from."

BIGGER & BETTER

LOCAL INVESTORS HAVE SIGHTS SET ON MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENTS

In 2007, Kentucky designated 363 acres in downtown Bowling Green as a Signature TIF under the state's tax increment financing legislation, ultimately creating a vibrant program that fuels downtown improvements.

Ten years later, New Millennium Real Estate – made up of Steve Sutton and siblings Mike and Mary Vitale – continue to see value in downtown and recently began construction on The VUE, an \$8 million commercial and residential development expected to be complete in 2018.

The three-story development sits on State Street, with Seventh and Eighth avenues serving as bookends. Because The Vue takes up Block 4 of the TIF district entirely, it was important to the developers that The Vue had a substantial look of a city block rather than a traditional three-story, 10-foot apartment building.





The property sits on about two acres and will consist of retail, restaurant and residential space.

Specialty clothing boutiques Zingarella and Pink Daisy will have storefronts on State Street and Eighth Avenue, respectively, while Home Café & Marketplace's owner-operator Josh Poling is expected to establish a new restaurant, Hickory & Oak, in the space.

The contemporary southern restaurant will occupy 5,500 square feet of space, including a large patio that will run the length of the building's Seventh Avenue side. Hickory & Oak is set to be open for lunch and dinner, with a more upscale dinner menu and large, metropolitan-style bar serving high-end adult cocktails. Poling also plans to have a "chef's table" that can be reserved by a party of 10 in which he'll walk guests through each course along with wine pairings.

The residential space is expected to have ample natural lighting, with large windows



and 12-foot tall ceilings. The units will have a combination of stained concrete and hardwood floors, with high-end appliance packages, granite countertops and some

balcony space. All units are either one- or two-bedroom. Mike Vitale believes that in order for downtown to continue to prosper, it's going to have to offer more resi-

dential space.

“Ultimately we need to have more bedrooms downtown in order to attract more amenities,” Vitale said. “Residents have to come first before the amenity providers. Once we have the amenity providers, we’ll have a more pedestrian-friendly, more active and thriving downtown.”

The Hub

With Bowling Green real estate booming, there is little land left unexplored in the city’s heart, so when developer David Chandler of Chandler Real Estate saw an opportunity on Lovers Lane – he leapt.

The Hub, a 103-acre development, is expected to be complete in the next five years, with a total capital investment of over \$200 million and ultimately the creation of about 400 jobs. The development will be comprised of multi-family living, a hotel, healthcare facility, restaurants, along with retail and office space. In 2016, Chandler purchased the 103 acres from Dr. Roy G. Cooksey, Jr.’s estate for \$4.15 million.

About 12 years ago, Chandler developed Chandler Park – also a multi-family development with hotels and med-

ical facilities – off Cave Mill Road.

“The Hub is really a parlay from Chandler Park,” Chandler said. “It’s just a bigger, better, bolder version.”

Med Center Health recently purchased about 10 acres and will be the development’s anchor healthcare tenant. American Bank and Trust, which is providing acquisition and development funds for the project, plans to build its new regional office at The Hub.

Chandler said The Hub’s multi-family

piece is going to be a fantastic element that doesn’t exist in Bowling Green.

The residential space is expected to consist of upper-end two- and three-story units, along with cottages.

Chandler said the development will be set apart by its amenity package, green space, resort-style pool and overall sense of community.

“As a community, you either grow or you fade,” Chandler said. This development “is important for me because I love Bowling

Green. It’s a fantastic piece of dirt. I hope Bowling Green continues to grow for lots of reasons – to improve schools, roads, infrastructure and all the things that come with a community thriving. We think the best is yet to come.”

Chandler also oversees development projects in Atlanta, Paducah, Evansville, Ind., Gallatin, Tenn., and Murfreesboro, Tenn.

READY FOR LIFTOFF

AS THE SOUTH CENTRAL KENTUCKY ECONOMY CONTINUES TO GROW, SO DOES THE NEED FOR WELL-TRAINED EMPLOYEES



To meet employers' demands, the Bowling Green Area Chamber of Commerce, in partnership with the Bowling Green Independent School District and the Warren County Public School District founded the talent initiative SCK LAUNCH, or South Central Kentucky Learning About Unique and New Careers Here. This overarching talent development strategy helps students raise career awareness, develop employability skills and leverage their options upon graduation. Through the initiative, students explore careers available in the seven sectors expected to see the most growth over the next 10 years: Construction; Healthcare; Hospitality; Manufacturing; Professional Services; Public Services; Transportation, Distribution & Logistics.

In 2016, a Steering Committee of business and education partners and four tactic teams met regularly to design specific components of the plan including career



shadowing, teacher externships, student led leadership and communications and marketing. The group collectively wrote a Community Plan and designed toolkits which will serve as the roadmap for schools and businesses who are implementing the initiative. To develop this unique educational model, the Chamber partnered with several entities, including:

- Ford NGL and Alignment USA, which helped the team envision pathway and academy models
- Franklin-Covey principles, which led the teams' work on employability skills
- Gallup work experience indicators,

which helped inform the career shadowing modules

The initiative officially kicked off in May 2017 and was followed by Educator Externships in June, where several high school educators "externed" at area companies to learn about local business environments and the types of careers students may pursue upon graduation. They sat down with CEOs, toured plants and heard from professionals about the issues facing their industries – all vital information and experiences to take back to the classroom.

Each of the participating educators spent a day at either Henkel Corporation, Hol-

iday Inn University Plaza, Med Center Health or U.S. Bank exploring various careers in those sectors.

In 2011, the Chamber led a capital campaign that raised \$1.4 million in private funding to make Bowling Green and Warren County the first community in the nation to put the Leader in Me culture in all classrooms in all public schools K through 12. Since then, The Leader in Me has been a point of differentiation—setting the foundation to increase the quality of the workforce and to grow our community's future leaders.

Building on that foundation, in September, Student Ambassador Team members in the Warren County school district participated in the first of 3 trainings to help students develop principle-centered leadership skills necessary to lead a strong and dynamic community. Student Ambassador Teams encourage students to act as catalysts among their peers, making measurable and significant impacts in their school and community. In achieving that mission, teams will lead campaigns and projects throughout the year.

In October, it was the students' turn to visit businesses, as local targeted businesses celebrated Targeted Business and Industry Month by welcoming students into their companies. During the visits, students toured local facilities and heard from employees about what kinds of positions are available and what a "day in the life" of their company looks like. Companies such as Kobe Aluminum Automotive Products, LLP; Essity, Henkel, the LORD Corporation and Berry Global welcomed students.

This milestone is a highly regarded standard set by FranklinCovey that any TLIM school may attain by producing outstanding results in school and student out-

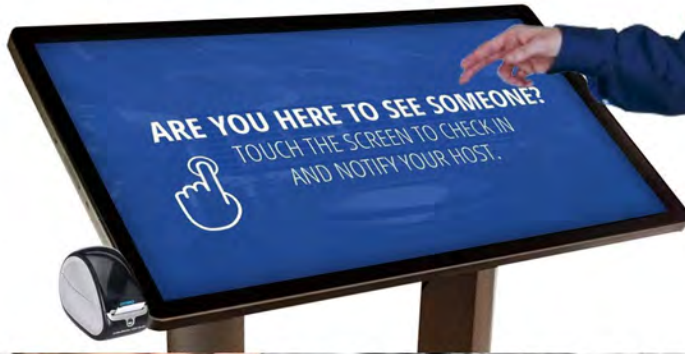

In October 2015, the employees at Sun Products' Dyersburg location received news that the plant would be shutting down and many would be relocating to the Bowling Green plant.

Following the shutdown, Sun Products, now Henkel, relocated about 20 employees and their families to the dish detergent company's Bowling Green facility. In an effort to smooth the transition for those affected by the closure, the Bowling Green Area Chamber of Commerce aided with its Key Hire Program, which matches future residents with Chamber volunteers who lead driving tours of the community and provide informational seminars about offerings in our area. Additionally, the future residents met with the Chamber, education leaders, realtors and more. Among that first group looking to relocate was Robert White, an operator at Henkel. Through the Key Hire Program, White met Crye-Leike Realtor Stacy Carter, who eased his move to the area. Carter led her group on neighborhood tours, showing off some of the highlights of Bowling Green, such as the National Corvette Museum, to get them acclimated to the community.

After the initial tours, White decided he was ready to relocate to the area. He considered houses in Bowling Green, Glasgow and Scottsville before finally settling on a home in a small subdivision in Franklin, just 16 miles from Henkel's Bowling Green plant.

"Those of us who work and live in the area pride ourselves on living here," Carter said. The Key Hire Program "shows an outsider how we work together and we're all on the same page for what we want. With this particular case, my goal was to make the experience a good one for them, so they could get some

excitement out of starting something new. I tried really hard to make them feel welcome and let them know that Bowling Green would welcome them when they got here.”

A Fluke

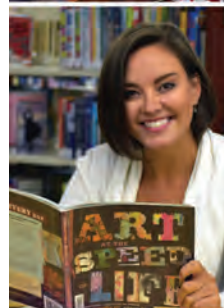
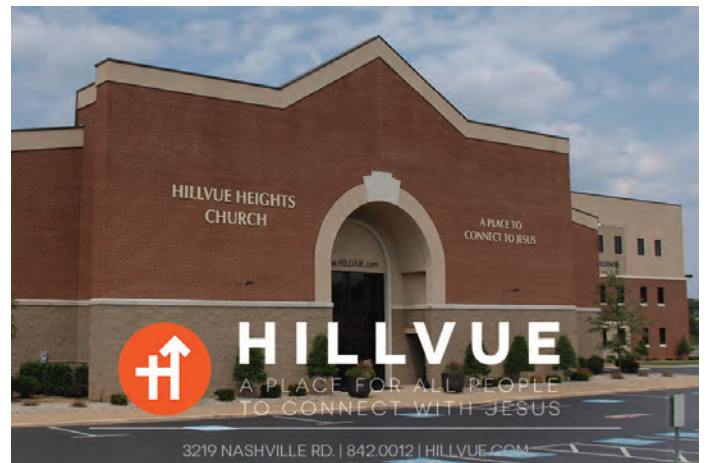

WHAT IS IT ABOUT BOWLING GREEN?

Bowling Green is a special place. Ask anyone from the lifelong resident to the boomerang to the transplant that never left and they will tell you that there's just something about Bowling Green. Some say there's something in the water but we think it's something even more special – a long held spirit of entrepreneurship and mentorship.

In 1853, the Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company (commonly known as the L&N Railroad) made plans to create a railroad line that would serve as a major route for trade and shipping throughout the United States.

Originally the South Central Kentucky portion of the route was slated to run through Glasgow, that is until a group of forward thinking businesspeople decided that major trade route needed to come through Bowling Green.

The Bowling Green and Tennessee Railroad Company was born, and funds were raised to ensure the L&N railroad line did finally come through Bowling Green.

That spirit of entrepreneurship has continued to grow with Bowling Green and has produced some world-renowned success stories.

In 1966, David Garvin was working at his parents' business, Beech Bend Amusement Park. The park was a popular destination with what was billed the world's largest campground attached.

As he interacted with patrons staying at the campground, he noticed that many of them requested supplies. And a business was born. Garvin secured a loan and opened a small store on the grounds of the park that offered the supplies his customers requested.



As the years went by, Garvin was able to develop a list of customers throughout the country and eventually expanded his business into mail order.

Today, Camping World is the nation's largest retailer of new and used RVs, RV accessories and RV-related services, with over 130 SuperCenters nationwide, a full-service call center and comprehensive website.

In 1983, Joe Natcher and a fellow businessman pooled their funds to purchase Bowling Green Frozen Foods, which opened 30 years earlier to serve the local restaurants in the Bowling Green area. Natcher had a vision for his company to provide premier product and outstanding service to his customers while creating a supportive working environment for his employees.

Natcher ran the business for nearly 30 years, and in that time the company

grew to nearly 30 times its original size. Throughout the years, Southern Foods developed strong relationships throughout the community and generously invested in several initiatives supporting young talent including Junior Achievement and the Chamber's The Leader in Me initiative for K-12 schools.

In 2013, Southern Foods was purchased by Reinhart Food Service where Natcher continues to serve in a consulting role.

These are just two stories of hundreds here in Bowling Green. Today, notable entrepreneurs like John Higgins of Bluegrass Supply Chain Services and Ed Griffin of Griff's Deli and Popworks help to carry on the tradition of entrepreneurship in Bowling Green.

Additionally, groups like the Bowling Green Young Professionals are helping to grow and mentor young talent as Bowling Green continues to grow and thrive.

The Public Theatre of Kentucky

Housed in the historic Phoenix Theatre, PTK hosts high-quality theatre, concerts, movie series and other performing arts events.

The 147-seat theatre was recently renovated to cater to intimate gatherings and shows, with a focus on enhancing Bowling Green's cultural scene.

PTK recently launched a free-to-the-public film series, screening cult classics such as John Hughes' *The Breakfast Club*, John Carpenter's *The Fog*, *Steel Magnolias* and more.

A STORIED HISTORY



1865

Ernest Hogan Born | Minstrel show and Vaudeville entertainer Ernest Hogan is born Ernest Reuben Crowders in Bowling Green's Shake-Rag district.

Columbia Theatre Constructed | In the 1930s, it was redesigned as a movie house and renamed Capitol Theatre.

Billy Vaughn Born | Billy Vaughn is born in Glasgow, Ky.

1933

Lost River Cave's Cavern Nightclub Opens | During blistering summers, locals headed to Lost River Cave, which maintains 57 degrees year-round, to escape the heat. The cavern becomes an underground nightclub hot-spot.

1946

The Quonset Auditorium Constructed | The Quonset opens its doors to Bowling Green and Dixie Highway's wayfarers.

1952

The Hilltoppers Release Top 10 Hit "Trying" | Billy Vaughn and Jimmy Sacca form the vocal group, the Hilltoppers. With the addition of Seymour Spiegelman and Don McGuire, the quarter records its first Top 10 hit single "Trying."

The Hilltoppers Perform on Ed Sullivan Show | Following their second hit, selling over one million copies, the Hilltoppers draw the attention of Ed Sullivan and later perform on the Ed Sullivan Show.

Sam Bush Born | Sam Bush, born April 13, 1952 in Bowling Green, is an American bluegrass mandolin player and is considered the originator of the Newgrass genre.

The Quonset Auditorium Closes Doors | Brothers Joe and Kenny Marshall close the auditorium and sell it in 1963.

The Capitol Theatre Closes Doors to Moviegoers | After screening films for more than three decades, the theatre closes its doors.

Newgrass Revival Forms | Sam Bush attends the Fiddlers Convention in North Carolina and was inspired by the the New Deal String Band. Later that year, Bush joins the Bluegrass Alliance, which dissolves and is reformed as the New Grass Revival.

South Union Shaker Village

Take a short drive west of Bowling Green to explore the serene life of the Shakers, an innovative, hard-working religious group. The Shaker community was established in 1807 and closed in 1922. The village site consists of several restored buildings including the 1824 Centre House, which contains one of the largest collections of Shaker furniture in the U.S., along with original furniture, crafts, textiles and manuscripts. **March-November: Tuesday-Saturday: 9 a.m.-5 p.m.;** **Sunday 1-5 p.m.;** **December-February: Tuesday-Saturday: 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Closed New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.**



ATTRACTIONS

National Corvette Museum

Bowling Green is the only place in the world that produces America's beloved sports car: the Corvette. An homage to the legend, the National Corvette Museum features over 80 Corvettes in periodic settings, including mint classics, one-of-a-kind prototypes and modern-day wonders of engineering and design. Test your knowledge at interactive kiosks and even try on the 2015 Stingray for size in the lobby. Finish your visit with a bite to eat in the Corvette Café, then race over to the NCM Motorsports Park to spectate or take a lap. Located just off Interstate 65, Bowling Green invites you to experience firsthand the passion, awe and thrill of the Corvette mecca. **Open 8 a.m.-5 p.m., seven days a week year-round except New Year's Day, Easter, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.**

NCM Motorsports Park

The more than 200-acre Motorsports Park was modeled to be identical to the Circuit de la Sarthe in Le Mans, France. The Park's initial phase consists of a twin circuit arrangement of a two mile/13 turn west course and a one mile/10 turn east course designed to be combined into multiple configurations. The courses may be used independently for multiple events or connected together into a unique large course. Stop by the Control Tower and take advantage of the open-air viewing deck. In July 2017, the Park opened the NCM Kartplex on its new karting track.

Beech Bend Raceway Park

Located on 379 acres, Beech Bend encompasses an amusement park, drag strip, oval track and campgrounds. Beech Bend Raceway annually brings in more than 500,000 visitors. Rarely does a weekend go by here without special activities and events. **Hours vary by event.**

The ultimate Corvette experience starts at the GM Bowling Green Assembly Plant – the only place in the world where Corvettes are made. The facility offers public tours which give guests the opportunity to watch the assembly process and learn about state-of-the-art American automotive manufacturing. Check out the one-mile walking tour to witness the birth of new Corvettes and the thrilling drive off the end of the assembly line. Tours resume in 2019.

Aviation Heritage Park

Since the early 1900s, South Central Kentucky has played an important role in the history of aviation. This moving memorial features five restored military aircraft with compelling ties to local heroes in the Vietnam, Korean and Cold wars. Visitors will also find the NASA T-38 Talon, the world's first supersonic trainer used by the USAF before NASA astronauts began using them for travel and as chase planes. The park is free to the public. **Open daily from dawn to dusk.**

Bowling Green Ballpark

The 4,500-seat baseball stadium in downtown Bowling Green is home to the Bowling Green Hot Rods, Class A affiliate of the Tampa Bay Devil Rays. The park serves as a year-round community entertainment venue for baseball, concerts, meeting spaces, fundraisers and more.

SOUTH CENTRAL KENTUCKY OFFERS A VARIETY OF ATTRACTIONS, DINING & LODGING

Tourism is vital to the economic health of a community. Fortunately for Bowling Green-Warren County, its variety of attractions, dining and lodging make for a robust travel experience while bringing new money into the local economy each year.

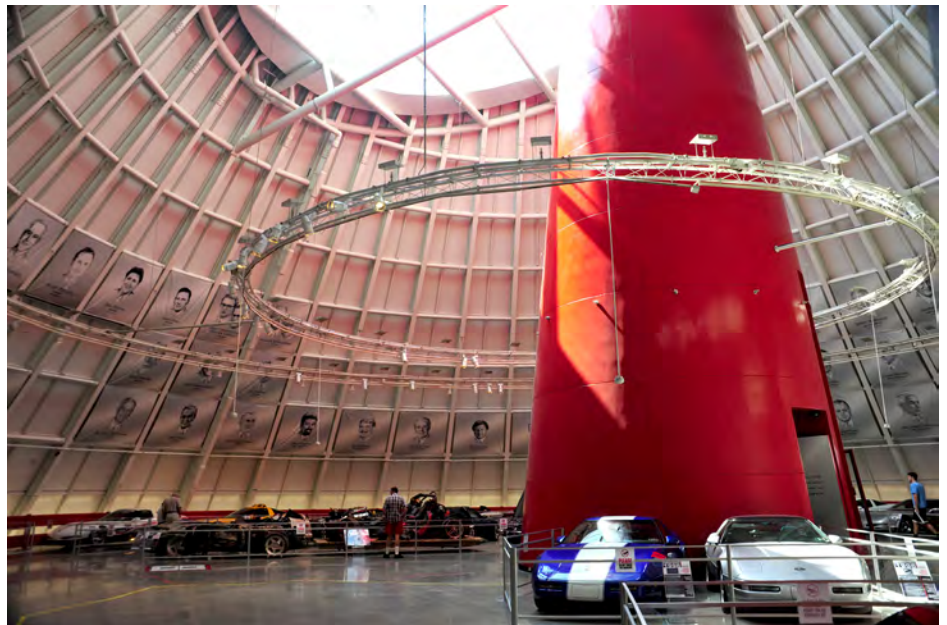
Total tourism spending in Warren County grew by 5.4 percent in 2016 to \$435.7 million, according to the most recent figures from an annual study of tourism spending in Kentucky that Certec Inc. produced for the Kentucky Tourism, Arts and Heritage Cabinet.

"We are thrilled that tourism provides such a boost to our area economy," said Vicki Fitch, executive director of the Bowling Green Area Convention & Visitors Bureau. "Bowling Green and Warren County are home to so many wonderful attractions and events that just keep bringing visitors to our community. From motorsports to the fine arts and cave exploration to shopping, there really is something for visitors of all ages to enjoy."

The CVB, along with area attractions, lodging and restaurants, work year-round to bring tourists to the community, and those efforts have helped Bowling Green-Warren County see that jump in tourism spending. The travel industry is one of the state's top industries – in 2016, tourism brought in \$14.5 billion to the state. The 10-county Caves, Lakes & Corvettes region, which includes Warren County, saw a 6.6 percent increase in total tourism spending, \$709.3 million.

Many of our tourists are adrenaline junkies who are drawn to the area by the sights and sounds of a car racing down a drag strip, around an oval track or along a road course. In 2017, automotive events again played a large role in bringing visitors to the area.

Holley LS Fest organizers reported that 2017 festivities at Beech Bend Raceway



and the NCM Motorsports Park were their largest yet.

It's not just racing that brings automotive fans to Bowling Green and Warren County. Car shows also rev up the excitement in our area. Events such as the Danchuk Tri-Five Nationals bring gearheads to Beech Bend Raceway for both racing and a car show.

"The scope of what was laid out before us was almost too huge to comprehend," according to SuperChevy.com. "Over 2,700 Tri-Five Chevys were sprawled out as far as our eyes could see. Every color combo, build style and body design you could imagine was there to be drooled over."

Sports events continue to make their tourism mark on the region, as well. Bowling Green has a partnership with the Mid-South Conference to host many of its NAIA collegiate championships, and local parks are home to youth tournaments in sports ranging from softball to soccer.

Warren County Parks and Recreation Department's new gymnasiums at Michael Buchanon Park and Ephram White Park

will provide two new, indoor venues that will bring tournaments to the area year-round. The CVB will work with the parks and recreation department to find sports tourism events for those facilities. The eight softball diamonds at Buchanon Park help bring top-notch tournaments to town each year.

"We love that Bowling Green-Warren County hosts sports tournaments," Fitch said. "These tournaments often bring entire families who spend several nights in our hotels, visit many of our restaurants and even find time to visit some of our great stores."

Thousands of tourists from across the U.S. and several countries visited Bowling Green on Aug. 21, 2017 for the Great American Solar Eclipse because half of Warren County was in the eclipse's path of totality.

Many of these visitors spent several days in Warren County. Bowling Green attractions, including Chaney's Dairy Barn, the Historic Railpark & Train Museum, Bowling Green Ballpark, Aviation Heritage Park, Western Kentucky University's Houchens

Smith Stadium and the WKU Farm, hosted special events with eclipse viewing as the centerpiece.

“What an amazing experience,” Fitch said. “We loved being a big part of this once-in-a-lifetime event, and we were glad so many visitors decided to make Warren County their viewing place for the eclipse. I am sure many of our visitors were pleased with the hospitality of our local businesses during this spectacular celestial show.”

The CVB welcomes visitors to its main office at 352 Three Springs Road and in a kiosk inside the National Corvette Museum. Our Visit Bowling Green app is available through iTunes and Google Play, and it helps visitors and residents plan their outings with an event calendar, GPS-enabled directions and recommendations for dining, shopping and attractions, based on interests. The CVB can be found at VisitBGKY.com or @VisitBGKY on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Pinterest.

The Bowling Green Area Visitors Guide is updated every year and is available throughout the city, as well at Kentucky Welcome Centers and rest areas along Interstate 65.

Another valuable benefit for local businesses whose employees interact with visitors is the free hospitality training program called VETTE -- Very Enthusiastic Travel and Tourism Experts. Classes are offered throughout the year.

The CVB staff cultivates relationships with local, national and international media outlets to showcase the area through both advertising and editorial opportunities.

In 2017, the CVB helped local attractions and businesses get coverage in dozens of media outlets, including U.S. News & World Report, USA Today, The Dallas Morning News, CNN, and Southern Living Magazine. Print advertisements appeared in Endless Vacation, AAA Living, Long

Weekends, American Road and more. The CVB puts visitors first so that they may have a wonderful experience – and hopefully come back to visit and bring friends.

WCPS is composed of 14 elementary schools, four middle schools and four high schools, as well as several alternative schools, including Lighthouse Academy, Beacon Academy and Geo International High School, Kentucky's first international high school.

KPREP Assessment Scores released by the Kentucky Department of Education recognize WCPS as a "Proficient and Progressing School District." Additionally, half of WCPS schools are recognized as Distinguished including:

Since the 1880s, Bowling Green Independent School District has been known for excellence in academic programs and success on the athletic field. The district's mission is to lead the way in education and encourage and recognize distinction in every field of human endeavor. The 2017-18 school year is the second of a three-year strategic plan with five key objectives centered on student achievement, employee recruitment and retention, efficient financial processes, stakeholder engagement and innovative technology implementation.

New this school year are two programs for students offering opportunities in science, technology, engineering and math. First, Innovation Headquarters began in August 2017, bringing together fifth-graders identified as gifted and talented from all five of the Bowling Green elementary schools. The group of about 60 students are transported two school days per month to the district's Professional Development and Learning Center. The students spend iHQ days completing a variety of activities and as the tagline of the program states, iHQ is where gifted minds explore.

Also in August 2017, Bowling Green High School Medical Arts Academy opened its doors. This program provides opportunities for career exploration while in high school, in one of Kentucky's top five workforce sectors: healthcare. Currently, 208 students are pursuing one of four pathways:

- EKG technician
- Fire Science
- Phlebotomy Technician
- Pre-Nursing

The school hopes to add EMT and Medical Administrative Assisting in the future. The opening of the Medical Arts Academy has been made possible through support from the Bowling Green

THE GATTON ACADEMY

The Gatton Academy of Mathematics and Science is Kentucky's first residential high school for students interested in pursuing advanced careers in the STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) fields. Gatton students are full-time college students at Western Kentucky University, taking all their classes with regularly enrolled college students while living in a community built specifically for them in the newly expanded Florence Schneider Hall. Funded by the state, Gatton has reached its maximum funded enrollment of 192 students. The Gatton Academy empowers Kentucky's exceptional young scientists and mathematicians to live and learn in an environment that offers advanced educational opportunities in a community of peers, which prepares them for leadership roles. Students may take part in research led by WKU faculty members. These one-on-one mentorships allow students to work on STEM research projects outside of the classroom. Students may participate in study abroad programs in Costa Rica, England, Greece or Italy. In its 11th year, The Gatton Academy has been named to The Washington Post's list of Top Performing Schools with Elite Students for nine consecutive years.

ATC PREPARES STUDENTS FOR LIFE AFTER HIGH SCHOOL

The Warren County Area Technology Center offers technical training to high school students within Warren County Public Schools. The ATC works to ensure all students receive the necessary preparation in their chosen career path. Courses focus on career readiness while preparing students for a seamless transition into a post-secondary institution or a career setting. National industry certification is offered in each of the school's program areas. The ATC works to partner with local businesses that host field trips and facility tours. Students earn dual credit with the Southcentral Kentucky Community and Technical College in most program areas.

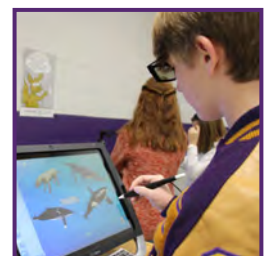

Area Chamber of Commerce, the Ford Foundation, as well as local healthcare and post-secondary organizations. Additionally, BGHS received a Work Ready Skills grant from the Kentucky Education and Workforce Development Cabinet.

Bowling Green High School is the district's next priority for construction and renovation. Since 2000, all elementary schools and BGJHS have been built or had major renovations. BGHS is approaching 50 years old and will begin the first of a two-phase project in the summer of 2018. The school, with the exception of the arena, will be completely rebuilt over the next several years. The priorities of the overall project include removing circular walls, adding natural light to all classrooms, increasing energy efficiency, displaying and honoring the school's traditions and history, improving traffic flow around the school and providing a cutting-edge learning environment for future generations.

Phase one of the project will add about 90,000 gross square feet to the existing school with a two-story structure, and includes classrooms for the LEAD Academy – attended by ninth-graders – the Medical Arts Academy, English, math, social studies, science, special education, English language learners departments, as well as band, choir and orchestra classrooms. If the budget permits, a kitchen will be added.

Phase two will begin as funding allows and will include classroom space for world languages, computer technology, art, business education, family and consumer science, and JROTC. Common student spaces will also be added in the second phase, including a two-story commons area, a 700-800 seat auditorium, media center, auxiliary gym, administrative offices, youth services center and possibly a natatorium. Although it may be several years before a new school is completed, our community will soon see construction begin on the future BGHS.

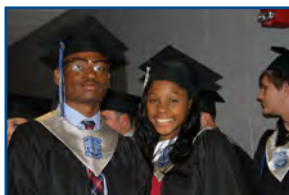

WCPS was the first school district in the state to have every preschool classroom earn the KY ALL STARS 5-Star rating for demonstrating excellence in early childhood education. The Kentucky Department of Education has recognized four WCPS preschool teachers for having Classrooms of Excellence. Christina Sanders of Rich Pond Elementary, Donna Williams of Plano Elementary, as well as Kahlie Claywell and Lisa Miller of Bristow Elementary, are among only 50 teachers in the state to have received this recognition out of the more than 1,000 preschool classrooms in Kentucky.

In 2017, WCPS expanded its Leader in Me initiative to include middle and high school students and provided training and professional development for administrators and teachers to build students' leadership skills. WCPS leads the state with seven Lighthouse Schools, and more are soon to be named. Briarwood and Natcher elementary schools were the first two Lighthouse Schools in Kentucky in 2014, followed by Alvaton and Plano in 2015, North Warren in 2016 and Cumberland Trace and Rockfield in 2017.

The district's Energy Conservation Program is another unique aspect of WCPS that has garnered international recognition since its implementation in 2003, with a cost savings of more than \$11 million. Now, 22 out of 23 buildings are classified as Energy Star certi-



fied. Richardsville Elementary School opened in 2010 and became the nation's first Net-Zero school, meaning it produces more energy than it consumes. Bristow Elementary, Jody Richards Elementary, South Warren Middle and South Warren High are Net-Zero Ready schools and have the capability to produce more energy than is consumed in the facility.

WCPS prides itself on its state-of-the-art facilities. Warren Central and Warren East high schools have undergone significant renovations totaling more than \$29 million, and

WCPS is in the process of constructing another state-of-the-art facility set to open in 2018, Jennings Creek Elementary School.

WCPS operates the largest transportation and dining services operation in the region with more than a million miles traveled by the transportation department and more than three million meals served each year. In 2017, WCPS was recognized for having the "Top Overall Transportation Department" in the state, a testament to the district's commitment to providing student safety.

WESTERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY

WKU WELCOMES NEW PRESIDENT, FIRST LADY

Presidential transitions have been rare in the life of Western Kentucky University. In its 111-year history, only 10 individuals have served as the University's president. On July 1, 2017, the community welcomed

Timothy C. Caboni, PhD, as WKU's 10th president. Upon meeting President Caboni, one will immediately notice several things: his smile, infectious laugh, abundant energy ... and his signature bowtie. Talk with him for a few minutes and also

apparent is the excitement and pride he has in returning to lead his alma mater. "In my first few months on the job I have met hundreds of people - university faculty, staff and students; alumni and donors; business and community leaders; and



elected officials from across the state and in Washington," Caboni said. "One thing that is consistent among everyone is a great optimism for WKU's future. This is a terrific place with wonderful people, and I'm excited about where we will go from here."

The Path to the Presidency

A native of New Orleans, Caboni spent his undergraduate career at Louisiana State University, earning a bachelor's degree in speech communication and rhetoric. After graduating with a master's degree from WKU in 1994, Caboni worked at Loyola University as assistant director of alumni



relations and senior development officer. That experience spurred him to pursue a doctorate in leadership and policy studies with a concentration in institutional advancement and public policy at Vanderbilt University. After earning his PhD in 2001, he began teaching at Vanderbilt and then became the founding chair of Peabody Professional Institutes and associate dean of the Peabody College of Education and Human Development.

In 2011, Caboni was named vice chancellor for Public Affairs at the University of Kansas. In addition to his administrative duties, which included being the chief university spokesman and overseeing marketing and communications, Caboni continued to teach. He also conducted research, serving as a co-principal investigator on a \$10 million federal grant and co-authoring a book.

WKU's 10th President

From his first introduction to the campus, President Caboni has espoused his philosophy that great universities inspire innovation, elevate communities and transform lives, and that is the University's guiding mission. During his inaugural year as president, Caboni is leading a comprehensive strategic planning process to serve as a roadmap for WKU's next decade of growth. "This process is inclusive, and we are engaging every stakeholder group in meaningful conversations about shared aspirations," Caboni said. "Going forward, we will ensure that data guides our strategic choices, and the end result will be a practical and revisable roadmap for WKU's future."

The Ultimate College Experience

WKU is a student-centered, applied research university, which as Caboni often explains, "means that WKU students can have experiences alongside faculty who know their name, who care deeply about their success and who want them to graduate in four years. They will also have a research experience here that is practically oriented and that addresses real issues," Caboni said. "That's important to students, but it's also important to our partners in the business community as well as in healthcare, the service industry and the arts. WKU students leave here prepared to make a good living, but more importantly, we want them to make a good life for themselves and for those

around them."

About half of WKU graduates are first-generation graduates, and faculty and staff are working hard to make WKU more welcoming, more accessible and more easily understood. That same welcoming and engaging mindset applies beyond the University's campus borders. "What we do as a university enhances the Bowling Green community and the entire region," Caboni said. "Of course there is the overall economic impact that a major university brings – the students, faculty and staff who live and work here, and many of the graduates we produce stay in the area. University partnerships with business and industry, our participation and support of the Chamber of Commerce and certainly the athletic events, theater and musical productions we host and the speakers we bring to the campus – all of that helps drive the economy and the quality of life in our region."

"Great universities make great communities – and great communities support their universities. On Saturdays in the fall, I want Bowling Green to be red, red, red," Caboni said. "No matter where you graduated from college or what other affinity someone might have, in Bowling Green, we show up and we wear red for WKU!"

President Caboni is married to Kacy Schmidt Caboni, who, in addition to being WKU's First Lady, serves as director of principal gifts and special initiatives in WKU's Office of Philanthropy and Alumni Engagement. Since 2006, Kacy represented the University of Kansas School of Business in the KU Endowment Association as a development officer, development director and, since 2015, development director and team leader. She was instrumental in the construction of Capitol Federal Hall, the new home of the KU business school, funded entirely through private philanthropy.

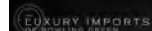

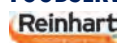
